Sound and District Primary School PE and Sport Premium 2018/19 Review and Impact

Sound & District Primary School is using the PE funding to raise the standard of teaching in PE across the whole school, to offer a wider range of sporting activities, to give the children more opportunities to engage in competitions and to encourage healthy lifestyles.

Key achievements to date:

- Sound School achieved the Platinum Sainsbury's Award this year. We were one of 6 schools out of the 32 across Crewe and Nantwich that applied for the award.
- This year we celebrated National Sports Week. Each child participated in a range of sports to excite and promote a love of sport. All of the children had the opportunity to try: Tri-Golf, Skiing, Netball, Football, take on the role of a leader and Scooter or Skateboarding. Many of these providers were local and promoted their community links within the school. From these opportunities, many of the children tried a new sport they had never attempted before and we hope that these sports may become a regular past time for some of the pupils at the school. Participation in inter and intra school competitions has increased
- Each year we make a conscious effort to make local club links with the local community. This year, we have had sessions from All Stars Cricket, Ladyhawks Netball, Ministry of Yoga, Taekwondo, Miss Jolene's School of Dance, Boxing, Football sessions and Didi Rugby. These sessions helped to show the children the styles of sport that are available in the local community. The sessions were fun, engaging and highly active and as a result, many of the children took their information leaflets home and have since joined the clubs.
- All KSI children entered a sporting festival where they were able to visit a local college and partake in sport amongst other children in the local area.
- Due to the additional Swimming lessons that Sound provides, all children in Year 6 were able to meet the National Curriculum Swimming objects by the end of the year.
