Welcome to Emerald Class!

This booklet aims to outline a few changes as your child moves from Reception to Year One.

We are well aware that the move from Reception to Year One can be a big change. We have created this booklet for parents to help you stay well informed about the changes between Year One and Reception.

We have also created a booklet for your child with some activities to do in preparation for going into Year One in September!

We want this change to be a smooth transition where the children are happy and confident about going into their new class!



Year One – what's staying the same?

Children and teacher

All of Diamond Class children will be moving into Year One together! It's nice to know that all of the children's friends will be moving with them!

Mrs Styles will move with the children from Reception into Year One. Mrs Huntbach has also worked with the children during part of the Reception year and knows the children well.

Routines

We will continue the same daily routines as we have had in Reception during the last half term. The start of the day will look like this:

- Come into school and the children will perform their early morning jobs (such as putting coats on pegs, changing reading books, placing water bottles in the holder and book bags in the tray).
- Sit at tables to complete some handwriting practice.
- We will then complete the register and make lunch choices.
- Next the children begin Phonics and begin the lessons for the day.

We will keep this familiar routine to aid with the transition. There are a few changes in Year One as the reading books are kept outside the classroom so we will support the children to learn the amendments to the tasks they have been used to doing.

Break and lunchtimes

Although the Year One classroom is in another part of school and we will use different doors to enter and leave the school building, we will have break and lunchtime play in the same place. The children are used to playing in the playground and on the field.

Behaviour systems

We use the same behaviour system throughout the school and the Sound Superstars are a key theme throughout life at Sound!



Year One - what's different?

Classroom

We have a different place to line up and enter the classroom in Year One. We will also have a new classroom and cloakroom area. Mrs Styles will ensure there are familiar displays and toys for the children to use when they start in September. Here is a photograph of our wonderful Headteacher Mrs Minshall-Thomas in Year One with the children this year.



Snacks

Children in Key Stage One (Years One and Two) still get fruit snacks. We have plenty of fruit provided for morning and afternoon playtimes. Please don't bring in snacks from home for playtime.

We don't have milk in Year One.

Year One – what's different?

Curriculum

Whilst the children do work on daily Reading (including Phonics), English and Maths activities, Reception is predominantly a play based curriculum. There are opportunities throughout the day for children to play and learn with what they have chosen to do. They have been working on the Early Years Foundation Stage which is from birth until the end of Reception. Year One is part of the National Curriculum.

Whilst we move from this play based curriculum to a more structured one in Year One, there will still continue to be opportunities for play based learning. especially during the Autumn term. The structure of the day will change throughout the year to an increasingly formal set up where the children then complete mostly directed tasks.

Assessment is also different in Year One. Please see the table below to show the differences in the areas of learning:

In Year One we have set topics for each half term. We have set fiction and non-fiction units in English and we follow the White Rose scheme for Maths.
