

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

Please read regularly with your child, ideally each day. Regular reading practise is incredibly important to help children to develop their reading skills.


Please refer to the reading sheets handed out on the first day with ideas for how to support a range of reading skills at home. These can also be found on our class page on the website.

check children's decoding skills to sound out and read words.

There are 40 words to read.





<u>Class notices</u>

Inside the book bag each day, please bring:

- Reading book (which the children will change when they have read)
- Reading record
- High Frequency word/sound books (sent home soon)
- Also please ensure children bring their own water bottle each day. If possible, please can they not be placed in book bags as they may spill!
