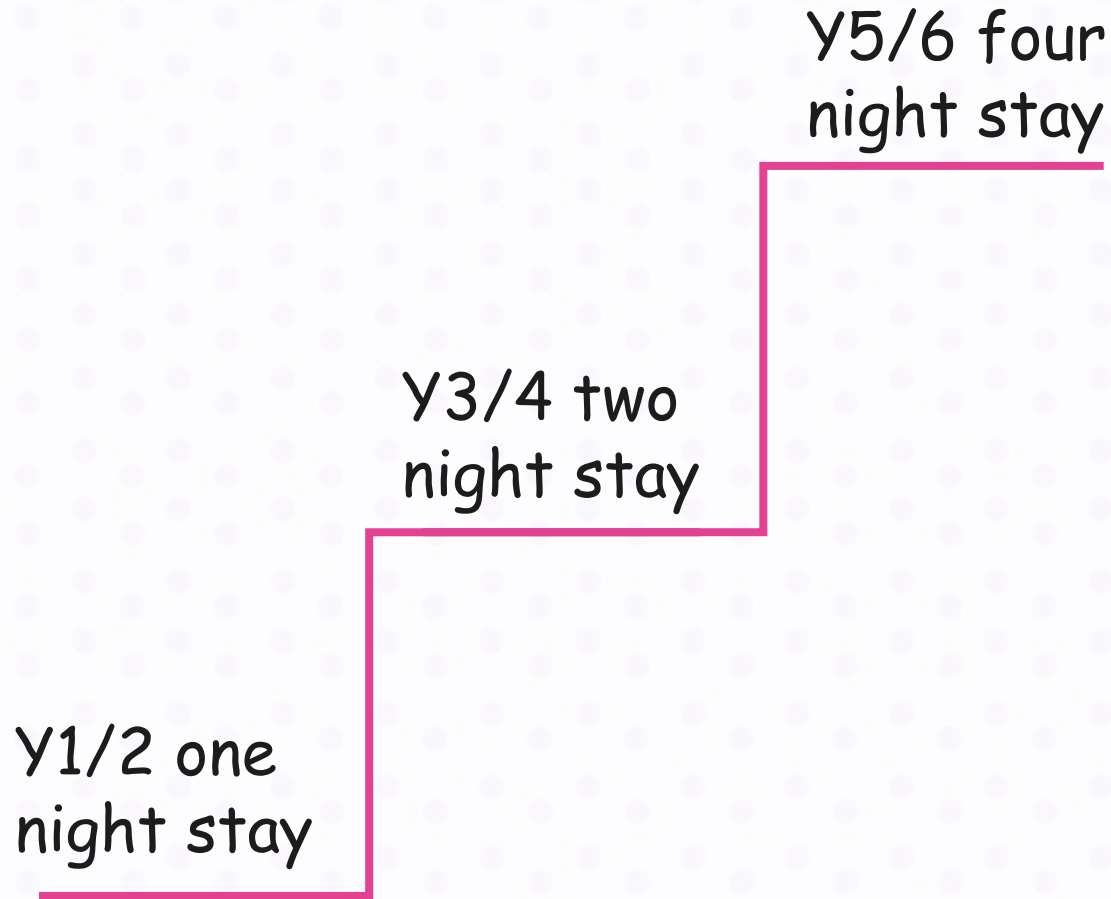

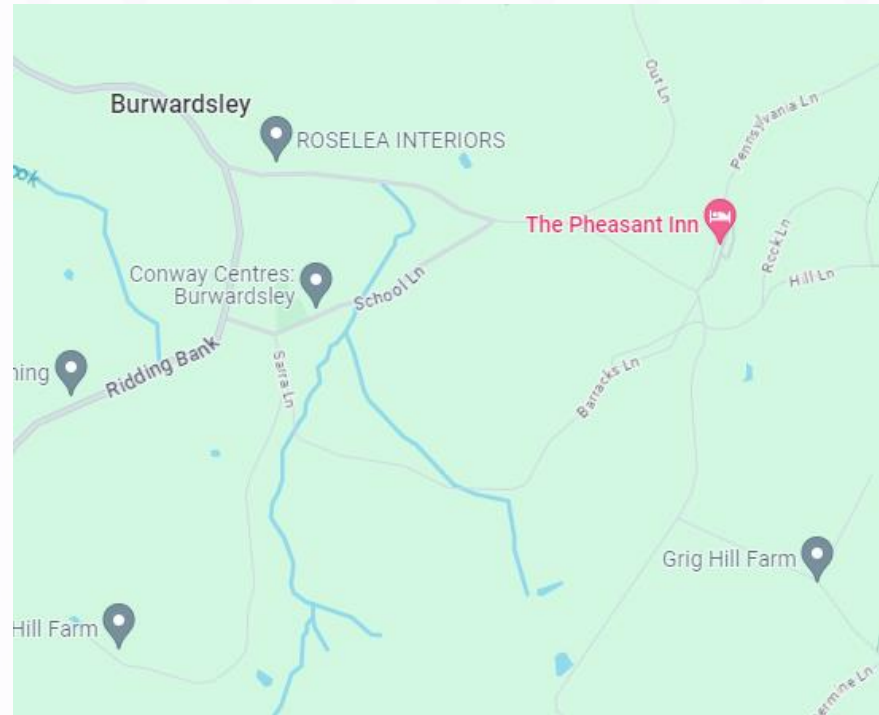
Residentials at Sound

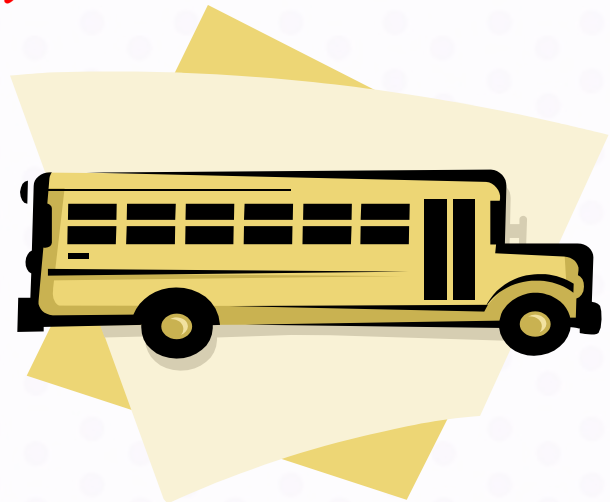

What about the food?

All meals (excluding arrival lunch) and snacks are provided by the centre.

Breakfast is toast and cereal.

Bacon, beans, hash browns and juice

Lunch is a choice of sandwiches - ham, cheese, tuna wrap or roll

Fruit, yogurt, biscuit and drink

For tea there is a choice of hot meals

- Pasta bolognaise or fish, chips and peas

as well as juice and desert (chocolate cake or jelly)

If there are any specific dietary requirements or allergies noted on medicine forms we will let the centre know.

All meals are chosen on arrival.

Is the centre safe?

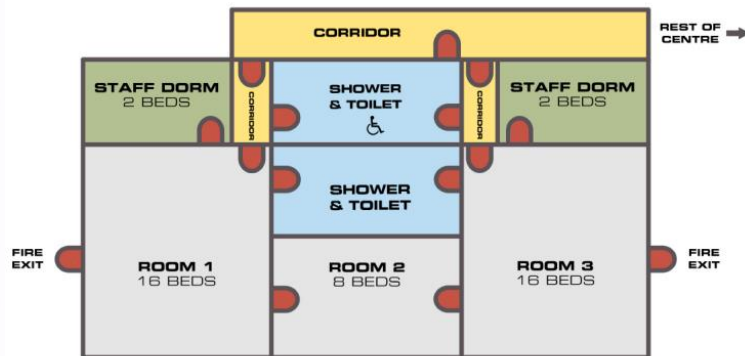
The main entrance has a numbered key pad and all external doors have an intruder alarm that can be switched on over night.

There are separate dormitories for boys and girls which sleep 21 in each.

Staff rooms are strategically placed next to the dorms.

To ensure safety at night, no food or sweets are allowed in the dormitories.

Teachers will have the medication and staff are trained in first aid.



Other things to know.

Should your child fall ill we will do our best to look after them. We will let you know as soon as is reasonable and discuss a suitable course of action.

At night the school staff are responsible for the children. The building is locked and is safe and secure.

We promise to keep you updated via text and our school blog - the wi-fi can be unreliable at times but we will do our best to updated.

Building up to the residential

We are aware that a residential at your child's age may be daunting for both yourself and your child.

1. Have a play date with someone in the class.
2. Arrange a sleepover at a friends/grandparents house.
3. Practise getting yourself ready for the day independently.
