



Safeguarding in our school

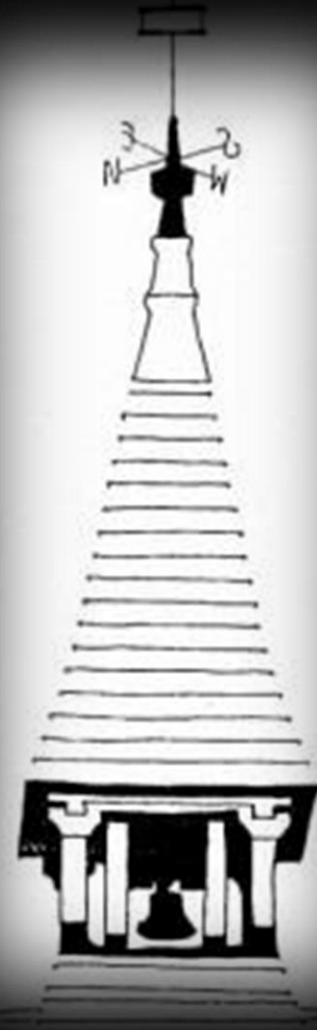
Report by Sound's Safeguarding and Attendance officers

We have made some suggestions as to how things could be even better.

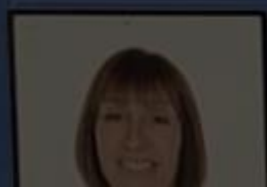
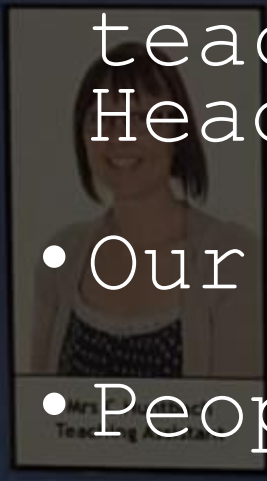
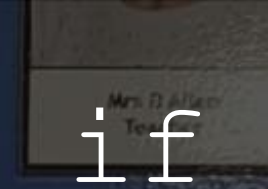
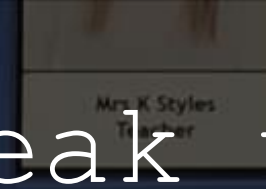
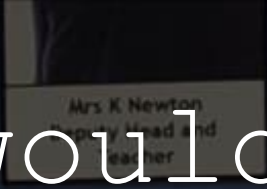
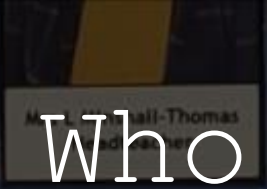
We all agreed that we feel safe in school.

Suggestions

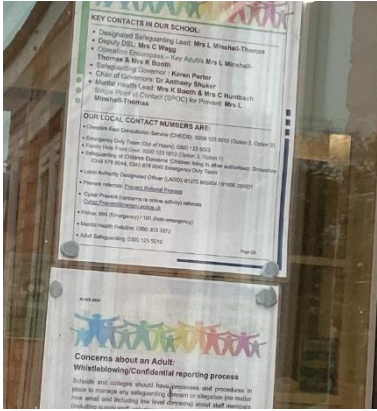
Invite in the NSPCC again

Do all parents go to the doors to see the posters- if not where else could they be put?



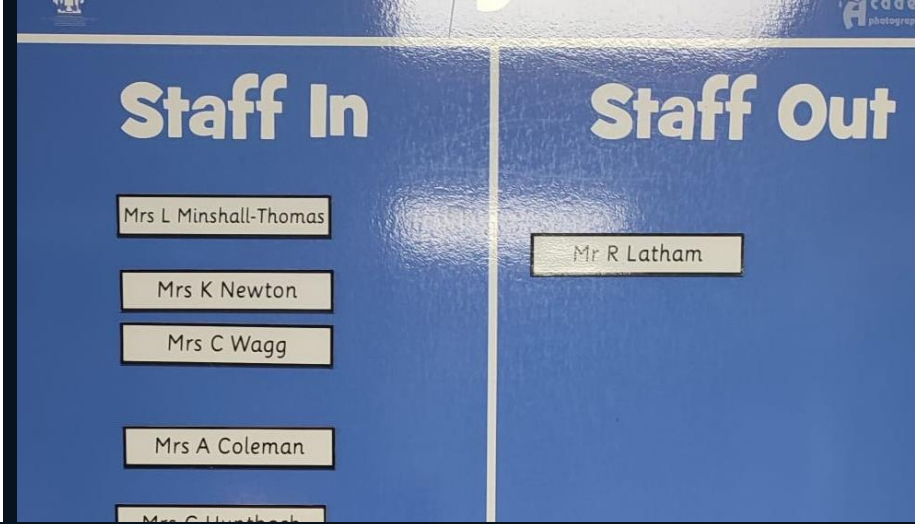
How is our school kept secure?

- Push buttons and keypads on all the doors to the outside
- Fences around the school playground
- Signposts to show people where they need to go
- Padlocks on the gates
- Buzzers for visitors to press
- The back gate has a padlock and a buzzer to get attention from someone in the office so people can't just wander in

Question

Are the signposts all pointing in the right directions?

How are we kept safe from fire?



- Clear “Fire equipment” signs and alarm buttons
- Lots of signs showing us which way to go in case of a fire
- Electrical equipment has stickers on to show it has been safety checked
- There are fire extinguishers; they have stickers on with dates to show they have been checked

Use gentleness at all times; we don't hurt others or their feelings.

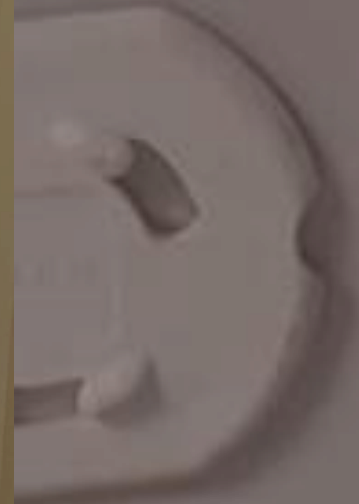
